#### A. CHANGES TO BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES

a. The Algonquin Township Road District (ATRD) established new communication protocols to work with the McHenry County Stormwater Manager.

  - i. Pamphlets and flyers were handed out at recycling events and to walk-in inquiries.
  - ii. Information has been provided online via our Facebook page, as well as our website.

#### b. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/INVOLVEMENT

- i. The township continues to hold monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of every month. We continue to take citizen commentary and comment on drainage and stormwater issues.
- ii. The ATRD has participated in the McHenry County Disaster Relief Management Team.
- iii. ATRD has successfully executed the required 7 recycling events collecting used paint, tires, electronics, and motor oil.
- iv. The ATRD has partnered with local nonprofit Environmental Defenders of McHenry County to maintain the first drop-off location for Styrofoam materials.

#### c. ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION AND ELIMINATION

- ATRD utilizes the GIS map created to locate storm sewer systems, discharge points and culverts.
- ii. ATRD has successfully executed 7 recycling events to collect used paint and used motor oil.
- iii. ATRD's website continues to accept questions, comments, and concerns.

#### d. CONSTRUCTION SITE RUNOFF CONTROL

- i. No residential construction permits were issued or constructions permits were completed in the township during the reporting period.
- ii. The ATRD follows the McHenry County Stormwater Ordinance which is enforced by the county.
