# 2020-21 Algonquin Township Road District Annual Report NPDES Number: ILR400002

#### A. CHANGES TO BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES

- a. The Algonquin Township Road District (ATHD) has improved its culvert replacement program by incorporating checks with the County Storm Water Management Division of the Planning and Development Department.
- b. The ATHD now has Elgin Recycling pick up recycled electronics on site instead of the ATHD delivering recycled electronics to the company.
- c. The ARTD actively participated in roadside clean up of storm debris and partners with the McHenry County Land Conservancy to replace lost oak trees.

#### B. STATUS OF COMPLIANCE WITH PERMIT CONDITIONS

- a. PUBLIC EDUCATION AND OUTREACH
  - i. Pamphlets and fliers were handed out and Recycling events and to walk-in inquiries.
  - ii. The ATHD utilizes signage on Northwest Highway to inform the constituency of upcoming events and recycling opportunities.
  - iii. Information has been provided online via social media as well as our website.

#### b. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/INVOLVEMENT

- The Township has been adversely impacted from the Coronavirus COVID-19.
   Meetings continue to held monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of every month online. We continue to take citizen commentary.
- ii. The ATHD participates in the McHenry County Water Resource Action Plan (WRAP) Task Force.
- iii. The ATHD has participated in the McHenry County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) to provide disaster relief when required.
- iv. ATHD has successfully executed the required seven (7) recycling events to collect used paint, motor oil, tires, batteries, and Styrofoam. However, due to the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic we will not have seven events in 2020-2021.
- v. The ATHD continues to partner with local nonprofit Environmental Defenders of McHenry County to maintain the first drop-off location for Styrofoam materials.

#### c. ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION AND ELIMINATION

- i. ATHD utilizes the GIS map created to locate storm sewer systems, discharge points and culverts.
- ii. ATHD has successfully executed seven (7) recycling events to collect used paint, used motor and cooking oil, tires, electronics, and large batteries.
- iii. ATHD's website continues to accept questions, comments and concerns.

#### d. CONSTRUCTION SITE RUNOFF CONTROL

i. No residential construction permits were issued or constructions permits were completed in the township during the reporting period.

- The township will continue to hold monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of every month. We will continue to take citizen commentary, concern and criticism.
- ii. The ATHD will attend at least two (2) McHenry County WRAP Task Force Meetings in 2020-21.
- iii. The ATHD will actively participate and coordinate with the McHenry County Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and attend meetings when required.
- iv. ATHD will attempt to execute at least seven (7) recycling events. However, due to the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic we may not have seven events in 2020-2021.

- i. ATHD will execute at least seven (7) recycling events.
- ii. ATHD will continue to maintain the website and allow for submissions and alerts of concerns and violation by constituents.
- iii. ATHD will maintain standard office hours, to be able to accepts phone calls or walk-in concerns about violations and issues.
